

EXECUTIVE ORDER NUMBER 16

WHEREAS, no consensus was reached or legislation passed in the 1996 Special Legislative Session revising the Mini-Code and while it continues to be necessary that changes to the Mini-Code be made; and

WHEREAS, the Mini-Code is a highly specialized area of the law and any proposed changes should only be made following detailed review and debate, and with the comments and suggestions of those who possess recognized expertise and experience in this field.

NOW THEREFORE, I, Fob James, Jr., Governor of the State of Alabama, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and laws of Alabama, and for other good and valid reasons, which relate thereto, do hereby order and direct the creation of the Governor's Mini-Code Task Force.

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED that this Task Force will be composed of a ten-member committee consisting of the following persons:

10. Todd Strange - Montgomery



BE IT FURTHER ORDERED that this committee shall review and evaluate proposed changes to the Mini-Code and report to the Governor within thirty (30) days with its suggestions on what changes would be proper, fair, and appropriate for presentation as legislation in the 1996 Regular Legislative Session.

BE IT FURTHERED ORDERED that this Executive Order shall become effective immediately upon the Governor's signature and shall remain in effect until amended or modified by the Governor.
